### Roll Call-

### Devotion/Prayer-

- The elders continued their review and discussion of the Bible Fellowship Church Articles of Faith with Article 24 Resurrection.
- The elders shared in a time of prayer and thanksgiving.

### Approval of Minutes-

 Motion was made to approve the minutes from the January 14, 2013 Board of Elders Meeting, seconded and approved.

### **Financial Report-**

- Treasurer Andy Brimer reviewed the January financial report. (Attachment 1)
- Motion was made to approve the report, seconded and approved.

### Membership-

- The elders reviewed two applications for membership.
- Motion was made to approve Susan Marsh and Zac Roberts as new members, seconded and approved.

### Pastor Mark's Ordination Process-

- As a result of Mark Culton's completion of the BFC ordination oral exam, he is eligible for an official call as a ministerial candidate.
- The BFC call form was issued and signed by all elders in attendance. (Attachment 2)
- Having received this official call, a motion was made to extend Mark the same pension benefit
  that is offered to the other pastors. The motion was seconded and approved.

### Articles of Faith Revisions for BFC Annual Conference-

- For discussion and vote.
- The elders discussed the two articles and the proposed changes: Article 21 The Lord's Day and Article 27 – The Kingdom of God
- The elders voted "yes" to approve the recommended changes by a count of 7-3 and 10-0 respectively. A response form will be submitted. (Attachment 3)
- It is important to note that delegates to the conference will also have the opportunity to vote individually.
- The delegates will communicate the outcome of the votes from conference to the Ebenezer congregation. Annual conference is the week of April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

### **Discussion Items-**

- College Ministry Mark Culton shared his burden for developing a college ministry that would be intended for people 18-25 years of age. The elders were supportive of the preliminary concept as described by Mark.
- 2) <u>Chairs in Sanctuary</u> Mike Capaldi reminded the elders that we had requested the chairs be placed in the Sanctuary to allow for ample seating, especially in first service.
- 3) <u>People Issues</u> The elders discussed some people issues and one discipline matter. Additional follow-up was requested.

### **Committee Reports-**

- Missions Chair Wayne Batten provided an update regarding the Messick family as they plan the next steps of their missionary journey. In addition, he shared a request from Robbin Hunsberger who will be taking a trip to Nepal. A request was made for additional missions-related vacation time to be granted. The elders agreed that we should maintain the current policy, which grants one week of missions-vacation, and that additional time required should be taken from the current vacation allotment.
- 2) <u>Assimilation</u> There was a brief discussion about assimilation that included the possible transfer of leadership from Andy Brimer to Scott Holwick. There was also mention of taking a different approach towards assimilation called "GROW". No decisions were made and the men agreed to keep this in prayer for the time being.

### Pastor Tim's Ministry Report February 11, 2013

**Preaching:** I am coming to the end of the book of Philippians. I have only the fourth chapter left to exposit. My prayer is that this last section of the book will truly help our people be living with a steadfast firmness until Christ returns. I am beginning to pray about the direction that the Lord would have me go for the summer. My goal at this point is to finish Philippians along with a short diversion for the Easter holiday. Then I would like to do a short series during the summer and pick up a longer study for the Fall of 2013.

**Prayer & Fasting**: I believe that many in the Church are participating with us as Elders in fasting and praying in the month of February asking God to help us. Overall, I believe the Church embraced my challenge from Nehemiah 1, which was to seek God's favor and direction for our ministry. My prayer is that the Elders and Church body will continue to seek God's direction for our ministry.

**Counseling:** I continue to meet with one man for discipleship on a regular basis. Also I am continually meeting with congregants for spiritual guidance and prayer.

**New Member Class:** Pastor Dick and I began a new member class three weeks ago with an attendance of 26. The class participation has been maintained. It is exciting to see people come to understand our doctrine and join our church. It has been a joy to work alongside Dick in teaching this class.

**New Class**: Currently we have over 20 signed up for our new class on Christian basic beliefs. I am very excited to teach this basic theology class in hopes that many of our church family will come to know Christ more in depth and His Word. I believe this class will become a regularly scheduled event.

YACS Retreat: I am currently studying to teach at the YACS retreat scheduled for February 15-17. I will be teaching three lessons from Romans 12 with the theme of Making Your Life Count. 1) Making your life count requires giving your life fully to God (v. 1-2). 2) Making your life count requires Serving Others with Humility (v. 3-8), 3) Making your life count requires loving others and being others-centered (v. 9-21).

**Worship Committee**: Jennie Flicker continues to do a great job of organizing and leading. She is able to take the talent we have and help them use their talents for the glory of God. I'm thankful for Jennie and all the leaders and servants who lead us each week in praise and worship.

**Staff**: We continue to work our way through "Ashamed of the Gospel" by John MacArthur. MacArthur's insight can be very polarizing. At times his frank insight is sharp and to the point. However, I believe that his wisdom and exegetical work has given us a great book in which to examine our church philosophy. I believe that our staff is hearing and thinking through what it means to have a Word centered, Word driven ministry. Overall, the staff is doing a wonderful job serving the Lord! I'm thankful for each and every one of them!

### POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Report – Jan 2013/Feb 2013

As I continue to study the gospels on my own, I was touched with the reality of how the highest times of great joy and happiness, can be immediately followed by the lowest valleys of trails and despair. This seems to be the way life is for those who are followers of Jesus Christ, after, wasn't that what happen to Jesus in the following passages?

"In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."" (Mark 1:9–11, ESV)

### Followed by...

"The Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. And he was in the wilderness forty days, being tempted by Satan. And he was with the wild animals, and the angels were ministering to him." (Mark 1:12–13, ESV)

There it is, the great proclamation of the Father at Jesus' baptism, followed the Spirits leading in the wildness to be tempted by Satan. But wait, did you catch the hope, God's presence was there through His angelic beings. Kind of reminds me of David's 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm...

"Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me." (Psalm 23:4, ESV)

### Kids Crossing

- Cross Time Sunday School:
  - o Praise the Lord we have a full complement of teachers for the time being!
  - Curriculum change: We met with the KC Leadership Team on January 21, and agreed to move forward with the "The Discipleship Project" curriculum change by Fall 2013. We will be meeting with the teachers on February 18 to hear from them concerning the sample material given to them at our last meeting in December 2012. We are still looking at what would replace our Wednesday night program. Currenty the options are, AWANA, or back to CSB/EG. Just received an email on a new CSB update, which we are investigating.
- Early Childhood (2&3 year-olds): 2<sup>nd</sup> service update: we have at least one head teacher candidate who is not a member but is currently in the membership class. Lord willing, by this time next month, this class will be reinstated!
- Children's Church: No change.
- Wednesday Evening Programs: Dave Lissy and his team, along with Carol Burress and her team are
  doing an outstanding job instilling into our children the Bible theme of the week, though they continue to
  fight discouragement for lack of volunteers and attendance. We are currently evaluating what will replace
  this program for next year.

WM team met on the 16th of January and has the entire year planned for, which include 3 conferences. One of these is the SHE LEADS held here at church. The two others are simulcast at other churches.

We plan on having a Mother/Daughter Breakfast (which Pastor Dick volunteered then men to cook and serve).

Unfortunately, I have had Doris Lynch step off the WM team. This was very disappointing. I also have a team member who will be having a baby in June (Amy Hardy). This will affect her involvement as well. I am praying over 3 different women that I have contacted to join WM.

I have had the privilege of leading devotions as MOPS and will soon start to meet one on one with a new lady."

### Discipleship Support

- **Kinship:** The Bob Gill/Neil Cowley group has split into two groups, the original group location will now be led by Otis Powell, and Bob Gill will be leading the new group with those from the original group that live closer to him. This arrangement seems to be working well. We are working on providing a leadership training class from which we hope to develop several new Kinship leaders.
- Membership Class: Praise the Lord for the privilege to team-teach with Pastor Tim at this will attended (22-26) class. We've had great lively discussions and if all desire to become members, we may need to call on you brothers to help with the interview process.

### Student Ministries Report - January 2013

Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade others. But what we are is known to God, and I hope it is known also to your conscience. 12 We are not commending ourselves to you again but giving you cause to boast about us, so that you may be able to answer those who boast about outward appearance and not about what is in the heart. 13 For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you. 14 For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died;15 and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised.

2 Corinthians 5:11-15 ESV

- things were discussed about college ministry and our current YACS ministry. We are really praying about next steps, asking God for specific direction and vision.
- Had a debriefing meeting with some individuals who are an integral part of our Operation Christmas Child ministry every year. We talked about last year and how we can prepare for next year trying to be even more inter-generational in our approach!


