- 3) <u>Missions Conference</u> The elders discussed the Missions Conference 2016 and offered feedback. We discussed the Sunday sermons by Mark Fodale and Duane Moyer. We also discussed philosophy of ministry related to visitors and unchurched individuals. This was a good discussion about how we can better connect with visitors, especially us as elders.
- 4) Fundraising Swannie and Andy led a discussion about fundraising at Ebenezer and how we can best handle events that raise funds. There was a discussion about philosophy of ministry and also practical concerns with how funds come through events. It was agreed that there is a need to develop a policy on fundraising. Pat and Jeremy encouraged us to make sure we are wise with money and yet not discouraging to people who have a heart for outreach and evangelism.
- 5) Family Discipleship Ministry Andy shared about a ministry opportunity that will be available again this summer for the fifth year for families to learn how to study and memorize Scripture. Each family member will study at age appropriate levels, and everyone is invited to participate. This ministry also encourages dads to lead their families in Bible study and discipleship. There will be more information to come.
- 6) <u>Prime Timers</u> Pastor Tim and Pastor Dick are meeting with the Prime Timers this week to confirm details and plan the path forward.
- 7) <u>Discipleship Program</u> There have been more and more people who have come to Ebenezer who are in need of basic discipleship, and we are desiring to have an outlined process for how to disciple people. The book "The Walk" is going to be used as part of this. Mentoring relationships will be at the center. We would love to identify mature believers who can begin discipling now, with the hope that a culture is created where all believers disciple others.
- 8) PRC Update The PRC met and discussed all the staff activities. That assessment was a fruitful exercise. There is no recommendation as of now, but they will continue to keep an eye on the giving trend and will discuss with Pastor Tim and invite the deacons for prayer before moving in any direction or making any recommendation.





2016 Income vs Expenses





2016 Income vs Budget

Studying & Preaching:

- I continue to preach through 1 Peter on Sunday mornings. I have had some criticisms lately that my preaching is not "grace oriented" and "legalistic" at other times. For those in ministry, criticisms will always come. It is true that we all have blinders on and sometimes can't see ourselves the way others see us. I have always tried to take criticism as God's way of refining me. One man said, "We are never as bad as some say we are, nor are we as good as others say." I'm trying to take to heart these criticisms and pray through them asking the Lord to help me to be the best communicator of God's Word that I can be. At the same time, my commitment to expository preaching is strong. One of the healthy marks of any Church is that the pulpit is faithful in simply explaining the text with relevant application each and every week. I do not plan on compromising my commitment.
- I also continue to teach through Matthew on Wednesday night. We are having approximately 20-25 each week. We sing a couple of hymns, study the Word for about 30 minutes and then spend the remaining portion of time praying together. Wednesday night continues to be one of my favorite times. It is also a very important time for several of our members who work on Sunday and cannot be a part of the Lord's Day activities. This is one avenue where they can get connected with the Word and with others believers.

<u>Missions Conference</u>: Overall, the missions conference went very well. Our guest speakers did a great job preaching on Sunday morning and in the Bible study time. I'm thankful for all the work that the missions committee did to make this event successful.

New Membership Class: Pastor Dick and I performed the first of 4 membership classes in February. Dick taught the 2 sessions and I taught 2 sessions. We had 21 people in the class. It was a wonderful time of discipleship. Many of the attendees have already filled out their membership applications and some have been baptized. Currently we have 14 applications to approve and several more in the works.

Shepherding/Ministry:

- Pre-marital counseling continues for one couple meeting every Tuesday for an hour. We are going through "Preparing for Marriage God's Way" by Wayne Mack.
- Breakfast & Lunch with 7 individuals for encouragement.
- Provided counseling sessions for 4 people this month.

Mentoring/Accountability:

- TLT meetings with Covenant Bible Fellowship Church (Naples, Fl) with Jason Filbert continue to meet on the second Thursday of every month. It is very encouraging to hear how the Lord is working. They are planning on having full Sunday services beginning on April 3 at a local community center.
- TLT meetings with Forks BFC also continue to go well. We only meet once per quarter.
- I am beginning to meet a little more regularly with Laszlo. This last month he went to lunch with the staff and we discussed ministry philosophy and "Lordship Salvation." He was also able to sit in a premarital counseling session.

Harvest America: Overall, this ministry was successful. Steve Leaser put a whole lot of time into this event. Surprisingly (to me) we had over 200 in attendance. After the event we had

approximately 5 people respond with at least one profession of faith. We are following up on all who responded.

Prayer Committee: I recently met with a couple that has truly felt the desire to help Ebenezer put a little more emphasis on prayer. It is with joy that I have agreed to help them lead out and put together a prayer committee. The sole purpose of the committee would be to help foster more prayer and provide unique opportunities for the body at Ebenezer to pray. We will begin putting together a team over the next couple of months.

<u>Discipleship</u>: I am currently working close with Pastor Dick to put together a member interactive discipleship plan that enables mature members to come alongside new believers and others who need discipleship. I have bought 30 copies of the book, "The Walk" by Smallman. The book is designed to help infant believers begin their walk with Jesus. I have already orchestrated 2 mentor groups. We will be looking for mature Christian men and women to help us with this mentoring program. It is very exciting to see how the Lord is putting this together.

Other:

- My family had a wonderful dinner 1 family while Julie and I had dinner with another family in the Church.
- 3 Hospital visitations
- 8 home visits including some for special prayer & others who are wayward
- I continue to play basketball on Thursday evenings at the Church. I am able to lead a 15-minute devotion and challenge the 10-15 men there with the Word of God.
- Along with Shawn Sommons we visited the Cornerstone Counseling Center in Easton as a potential aid in counseling for our ministry. They seem to be Biblically centered.
- Performed many membership and baptism interviews throughout the month.
- 8 baptisms on March 13. Praise the Lord!

It is exciting to see the Lord work in people's lives and hear the testimonies of God's saving grace. I count it a privilege and an honor to serve as one of the Lord's ministers here at Ebenezer. May the Lord continue to bless our ministry here for His glory!

Pastor of Discipleship Report, Feb/Mar 2016

As I continue in my trek through the Old Testament, having finished the Psalms, I now am privileged to study the book of Proverbs. I recently found this beautiful section containing the if/then statements concerning wisdom. Here are the *ifs*...

"My son, if you receive my words and treasure up my commandments with you, making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding; yes, if you call out for insight and raise your voice for understanding, if you seek it like silver and search for it as for hidden treasures," (Proverbs 2:1–4, ESV)

Now the *thens*...

"then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God." (Proverbs 2:5, ESV)

"Then you will understand righteousness and justice and equity, every good path;" (Proverbs 2:9, ESV)

So it is clear that wisdom comes about through a series of *if-actions* on our part, like treasuring the word, crying out to God for it (James 1:5), and diligently seeking it as we would seek something profoundly valuable. As a result, *then*, we will be rewarded with receiving the wisdom of God, filtered through the fear of the Lord.

With that in mind, here is a quick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from February/March 2016:

Kids Crossing

- Cross Time Sunday School (10:05 AM): Praise the Lord that he has provided a complete roster of teachers and helpers. He has heard and answered our prayers with people who love him, and love children!
- Early Childhood (2&3 year-olds): Continuing to go well for both services and Sunday School. Praise the Lord, all teaching positions are filled. Please pray that the Lord will raise up a new coordinator to fill Anne Christiansen's spot.
- Children's Church: The Gospel Project curriculum worship segment continues to work well for Children's Church. We continue to see between 8-12 students each week. Please pray that the Lord will raise up a couple to fill in our currently empty team (D) slot. In the interim we are on a 3 team rotation to facilitate the need.
- New Security Check-in: The new check-in system continues to work well, for both Sunday morning Cross Time classes, and Wednesday night Awana. We are continuing to monitor the performance of the BCS iPads we are using.
- **Wednesday Evening Programs:** Our Awana program is blessed this year with around 60 children, which the elder's have the privilege of teaching both the T&T and Sparks groups, focusing in on the question, "Who is...?"...a series that highlights different people in the scriptures and their role in God's redemptive plan.
- New PA Background Check Requirements for Employees & Volunteers: There are still a number of volunteers who have not completed the Mandatory Reporter Training, though not required to serve.

Adult Ministry

- Adult Electives: We continue to teach around 100 adults in our winter/spring semester, with the following breakdown of classes:
 - 1 Corinthians Scott Holwick
 - Pastoral Epistles Dick Bickings

Continue to pray that the Lord raises up more adult teachers...we currently have 5.

• Men's Ministry:

O Bethel Series: There is only one multi-gender class this time around that meets on Tuesday evenings and is taught by Jason Lee, and one women-only class taught on Thursday evenings by Peggy Brimer.

o Men's Bible Studies/Prayer:

- Thursday mornings from 6:15 AM 7:30 AM, This early morning bible study group is currently in a study on "The Life and Ministry of Jesus Christ".
- Thursday mornings from 9:00 AM 10:30 AM, This Men's Bible Study is currently studying, "Act Like Men," by James MacDonald. There are currently 6-8 men involved in this study.
- We are currently praying about starting a new Saturday morning men's bible study, possibly centered around discipleship training.
- Women's Ministry: Here is an update from Laura...

"Bible Study: Both Monday evening and Tuesday mornings are studying Armor of God. Monday evening is lead by Vicki Cowley and Laurie Gill. Tuesdays are lead by myself. We have and average of 55 women going thru this study.

Tis So Sweet: Meets once a month and we average about 13 women studying the book of Ruth.

MOPS: This ministry continues to grow and this year with Jill Rathmell and Courtney Nagy are doing an amazing job leading and carrying the weight of responsibilities. We will be in need of new steering members for the fall. We will also need mentor moms that can be there on a more consistent basis.

MOM to MOM: This ministry even though small in numbers has had a vital impact on the lives of the moms that do attend. Lisa Pyles and Linda Feichter lead on Thursday mornings.

SHE LEADS: This years conference is in Reading on April 22nd. I have the humble privilege of speaking this year. I will be speaking on Jealousy in ministry.

Discipleship: I continue to meet and disciple in and outside of the church. I rejoice over the salvation of a woman who I have met with for 4 years. So excited to be able to come along side of her.
