Pastor Tim opened the meeting in prayer.


### **Roll Call**

### **Devotional & Prayer [Pastor Tim]**

Pastor Tim led the elders and deacons through a devotional from Philippians 4. Even as leaders we get anxious sometimes.

- We cannot be anxious
- We must pray
- We must give thanksgiving
- Our hearts and minds will be guarded by the peace of God
- We need to rejoice
- Why do we need to guard our hearts and minds? It shows that we are God dependent.



### Financial Report [Andy Brimer]

- Andy reviewed the financial report for this month. The giving this month has been a bit
  higher than it had been recently. While the projected spending for October was lower than
  other months, the total expenses were actually higher than anticipated. We are catching up
  a bit with our income, and this is encouraging. We pray that this continues. We should
  continue with judicious spending through the rest of the year as recommended by the
  finance committee.
- The audit committee met with an external firm to conduct a verification audit of the books for 2015; this will be completed by January 2016.
- A **motion** was made to approve the financial report. This was **seconded** and **passed**.
- Andy submitted the financial report for October 2015 (Attachment 1). Also submitted was an updated September 2015 report with a minor correction for a double counted interest.

### 2016 Budget Evaluation

- Andy led the elders and deacons through the 2016 budget line by line, highlighting certain areas of change.
  - o Salary possible reductions were discussed reimbursed expenses, etc..
  - o Reductions in discipleship ministries
  - o Additional money for outside audit
  - Missions possible reduction scenarios were discussed but in the end the elders felt led to keep missions where it is by faith that God will provide for His kingdom work.
  - o In the end there is a small increase in the budget from 2015 to 2016 between 1% and 2%.
- A motion was made to accept the budget. This was seconded and passed with 2 no's.

### **Miracle Month**

A **motion** was made to do miracle month once again so that we can give extravagantly to needs outside the church. The missions committee will decide where the needs are greatest. This was **seconded**, and **passed** with **3 no's** and **3 abstentions**.

### **Deacon Reports**

- Kevin shared about the church renovations. Kevin made a motion for the building
  committee to get the green light to continue planning for the foyer renovations, only to
  proceed with renovations with elder's approval. This was seconded and passed with 13
  yes's and 7 no's.
- Kevin also shared that as the elders care for those on our Shepherd's List, we should pass on the needs that we become aware of to the Care Giver's committee so that they can properly care for them.

### Shepherd's List

Pastor Tim shared that there are now separate shepherd lists which delineate members and regular attendees.

### **Adjournment & Prayer**

Dennis Flannigan closed in prayer and the meeting was adjourned.

The November 2015 Financial Report has the following attachments:

- October Financial Statement
- YTD Financial Statement
- Graphical representation of Income and Expenses vs Budget, Income vs Expense trends, and Asset trends

In reviewing the financial statements I would like to make the following comments:

- Total income for October was 111% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD income was 95% of the budgeted forecast.
- Expenses for September were 128% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD expenses were 97% of the annual forecast.
- The gap in spending vs income for has us approximately \$16,000 behind our actual expenses.
- The Finance team recommends that all non-essential spending cease for the remainder of 2015.

### Other:

 Members of the Audit Committee met with Darian Allen of Regan, Levin, Bloss, Brown & Savchak, P.C. to discuss engaging them to verify the EBFC financial records for 2015. The Audit Committee will complete some tasks as directed by the firm to keep the costs of the external audit to a minimum.

### **Student Ministries Report - October 2015**

"And David said, "Is there still anyone left of the house of Saul, that I may show him kindness for Jonathan's sake?..."

2 Samuel 9:1 ESV

I was recently listening to a lesson from a particular youth worker, and she spent some time in 2 Samuel 9 comparing the plight of Mephibosheth to the students in our youth group. Mephibosheth was paralyzed and living in hiding. As the only living descendant of Saul's he was a marked man. He could at any time be killed by David if seen as a threat to the throne or an enemy of the kingdom. Yet, despite this, David goes out of his way to show grace and covenant love to him. The love that David extends to Mephibosheth is merely an extension of the love David has received from God, because all of us are enemies of God, spiritually lame and without hope. Yet God, who is rich in mercy saw fit to seek us out, and bless us beyond belief with all spiritual blessings in Christ, healing us and restoring us to a place of privilege.

Many of our students are in a similar boat. They feel alone, often broken and without hope. More than anything else we desire that our students would experience this same covenant love of God, and we desire that they experience it through us as youth workers and the church body as a whole.
