

Roll Call

The following elders were present: Wayne Batten, Andy Brimer, Dick Bickings, Mark Culton, Tim Gibson, Scott Holwick, and Shawn Sommons. Byron Roth was excused absent.

Devotional & Prayer

Pastor Dick led the elders through a devotional time from 1 Samuel 17 on David and Goliath. Do we care more about our own skin, or the glory and majesty of God? How was David able to have such incredible faith? God had surely prepared him with the incidents of the bear and the lion. David had spent much time reflecting on the character of God and praising Him. May we have that same trust in God's power and desire for God's glory. The elders then spent some time in prayer.

Approval of Minutes

Motion was made to approve the minutes from the October 13, 2014 Board of Elders meeting, **seconded** and **passed**.

Financial Report

- <u>Current Status</u> Andy reviewed the financial report (Attachment 1). We are still light on income (92%), but our expenses were significantly less than projected. A **motion** was made to approve the financial report. This was **seconded** and **passed**.
- Roof Repair The repair of the church roof was discussed by the elders. This has become an immediate need. A **motion** was made to repair the roof, which will cost approximately \$42,856 and will be largely taken from savings. This was **seconded** and **passed**.

Discussion Items:

- 1) <u>Associate Worship Pastor Position</u> Wayne shared about the status of the search committee and asked for prayer as they continue to discern God's will.
- 2) <u>Membership and Discipline</u> The elders voted on the following for membership: Sebastian Gubitosi, Elaine Mead, John Mead, Courtney Nagy, Julie Sherk, James Vari, and John Paul Yost. All were **voted** on and **approved** for membership.
- 3) <u>Budget Meeting</u> The elders discussed the agenda for the December 7th budget meeting.

4) Elder Nominations -

- a) The elders discussed the nominations for elder and the qualifications that are set forth in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1. Specifically, we looked at the qualifications of having children who are believing (Titus 1:6). We believe that this phrase should be interpreted as "children who are faithful." The reasoning is as follows:
 - The majority of the scriptures in the New Testament translate the greek word *pistos* as faithful
 - The parallel passage in 1 Tim 3:1-6 more clearly defines this word in that the elder is to "manage his own household," which is something he is and should be capable of doing. However he cannot cause his children to become born again...
 - The list of requirements in these two passages are primarily about the man being evaluated for eldership and the conduct of his children is to support his Godly character.
 - Our doctrine of salvation prevents us from giving any indication that salvation is anything other than the gracious work of God.
 - b) We also discussed possible elder responsibilities with new elders coming on.
- 5) <u>Shepherding Lists</u> Tim encouraged us to follow up with the people on our shepherd's lists. It does make a difference.



Pastor Tim's Ministry Report November 10, 2014

Studying & Preaching: The study through the book of Hebrews is over. I have begun a new short series from the book of Psalms I've entitled "Living the Good Life." This series will last 5 weeks through the end of the year. We are going to study Psalm 1, 27, 42, 138, 49. Following this series, I plan on doing a couple of Christmas sermons. I am making plans to preach through the major topics of the book of Genesis in an expository manner.

Worship Pastor Search Committee: The search committee has been meeting regularly each week to discuss and pray through candidates who have submitted their resumes for our ministry position. We put together a questionnaire that we gave to each potential candidate to fill out so that we could get more information about his heart and vision. Currently we have a couple of candidates who we are planning on interviewing in the next week.

Nominating Committee: We have been very busy interviewing candidates for both elder and deacon. This year we have had 5 elder candidates and 1 deacon candidate. The process of interviewing has been tedious but rewarding as we see the Lord raising up new men to serve in the Church. I also spent time one on one with each of the candidates prior to the interview processes talking about their callings, giftings, etc.

<u>Membership Interviews</u>: I was able to interview Julie Sherk, James Vari, Courtney Nagy (also baptized her), & John Yost. This continues to be a blessing to see people added to the church on a regular basis!

<u>Transition Leadership Team (TLT) for Forks Church Plant</u>: I met with the TLT to help assist Tim Zuck in the Church planting process. This is very rewarding to see the Lord raise up a Church in Forks.

Marriage Counseling: I continue to meet every other week with a couple for marriage counseling. I am holding them accountable to make certain changes in their lives. I have also given them a couple of books to study through.

<u>Counseling/Lunch/Mentoring</u>: I was able to visit with 7 different church members this month over lunch or at their home to encourage them in the Lord. This is one of my favorite parts of ministry.

<u>Visitation</u>: I am contentiously making a strong effort to make home visits and hospital visits. I made 7 home visits this month, taking communion to several shut-ins. It is a joy to serve and be a part of these people's lives. I really love spending time with these families one on one.

<u>Campus Crusade</u>: On October 16, Ed Hannah invited me to teach the lesson at the CRU meeting. I taught Galatians 5:16-24 on the role of the Holy Spirit. It was exciting to spend time with about 30 college students and see how the Lord is using Ed Hannah to develop a great ministry on the Lehigh University campus.

Preaching Conference: On October 27, I took Mark Culton, Keith Strunk, Jeffry Vidal to Washington DC to a conference on Inerrancy led by Mark Dever and John MacArthur.

While it was a quick trip and long driving, it was very encouraging to be together and to sit under the teaching of such great men.

The last month has been extremely busy with meetings for both the nominating & search committee. It has also been busy with visitation, mentoring, & counseling. However, I see the Lord working in so many people's lives. It is a joy to serve the Lord here at Ebenezer Bible Fellowship Church.

POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Report Oct/Nov 2014

In my current personal bible reading and study, I recently read the very familiar story of David and Goliath in I Samuel 17. Sometimes this portion is so familiar that we miss the amazing spiritual insight of young David. Notice how David addresses Goliath in verses 46-47,

"This day the Lord will deliver you into my hand, and I will strike you down and cut off your head. And I will give the dead bodies of the host of the Philistines this day to the birds of the air and to the wild beasts of the earth, **that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel**, and that all this assembly may know that the Lord saves not with sword and spear. For **the battle is the Lord's**, and he will give you into our hand."" (I Samuel I 7:46–47, ESV)

Because the story of David and Goliath is so familiar, we often give it a fairy-tale-like viewpoint instead of realizing that this is a real story, with real people having real thinking, dialog and action. For David, it was all about how big and awesome God was and his concern for God's glory and that others might know the one true God.

The truth is, each day we live in a real world with real live people, enemies, trials, and pain. What is it that will help us triumph over these realities? It is not our abilities, intelligence, or weapons, but the reality that there is a God in Israel, or Bethlehem, or Nazareth, or you name it, and that our battles are his, not ours!

"Oh Lord, help me please to make you known in all of my personal trials and battles of life so that others may see and know you, Amen."

With that in mind, here is a quick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from October/November 2014:

Kids Crossing

- Cross Time Sunday School: Praise the Lord for the full complement of teachers he has given us! We are continuing to enjoy the Christ centered curriculum, "The Gospel Project", with the fall semester focusing in on the Life of Christ, his early ministry, his miracles, and his teaching. Please continue to pray however, that the Lord would provide a good pool of subs since many times we run into trouble throughout the year when our main teachers are on vacation or sick.
- Early Childhood (2&3 year-olds): Continuing to go well for both services and Sunday School.
- **Children's Church:** The Gospel Project curriculum worship segment continues to work well for Children's Church. We continue to see between 5-10 students each week.
- Wednesday Evening Programs: Our Awana program continues to be effective in teaching the scriptures to our kids through bible memorization, doctrinal truths, and the elder lead teaching of the book of Proverbs. We have seen a great number of children come into the Sparks group and we are in great need of more workers. Please pray that the Lord will send these necessary workers.

Please pray that the Lord would send forth some new adult elective teachers so that we may offer a variety of subjects, and give the current teachers a break. We currently only have 5 teachers.

Men's Ministry:

O **Bethel Series:** We are nearing the end of the first of three 7 week semesters and will be taking a month or so off for the holidays. We as teachers are greatly blessed by our journey through the NT along with close to 35 students attending our 3 classes. These classes are as follows, Jason Lee's Class, Tuesday evenings from 7:00-9:00 PM, Gail Tshudy's Class for women only, Thursday evenings from 7:00-9:00 PM, and Pastor Dick Bickings' Class on Saturday mornings from 8:00-10:00 AM.

Men's Bible Studies/Prayer:

- Tuesday mornings from 6:15 AM 8:00 AM, Men's prayer time with currently only 2 men attending.
- Thursday mornings from 6:15 AM 7:30 AM, This early morning bible study group is currently doing a study on Ezra & Nehemiah.
- Women's Ministry: Here is an update from Laura...

"The women's ministry team is excited to have a new member, Linda Feichter. Linda longs to be involved and is currently helping Vicki on Monday evenings facilitating bible study.

MOPS: Mops is in full swing and we are loving it. We currently have about 38 moms coming this year. We could always use some more help in the moppets category.

The Truth Home is our service project for the year. We recently had Kim Checkeye come and speak. The moms are very excited about blessing them at Christmas time.

Cancellation of Grace Again: We did have to cancel our conference due to lack of numbers for this event. Our team will really pray about what it would look like to offer it again.

I hosted a prime timer luncheon and had I0 ladies around my table sharing their testimonies. This is a highlight.

Tuesday, November 11th hosting a night for newer ladies to the church with the hopes of making some connections and hopefully just making them feel like they belong in EBFC.

Bible Study is going strong. The ladies are really enjoying it. We will start James McDonald's study: "Always True" in January."
