



### Pastor Tim's Ministry Report November 13, 2017

### **Studying & Preaching:**

- I am finishing up the story of Joseph through the book of Genesis. I will complete the exposition by the end of the year or early in January. It has been a very fruitful study learning about the providential hand of God.
- I received many words of appreciation for the series on the Reformation in the month of October. Overall, it was a very good study. I think it was a highlight of the year.
- I am currently expositing through Ezra on Wednesday night. We have had an increase of attendance with approximately 25-30 showing up each week for singing, bible study and prayer time. It truly is one of my favorite nights of the week. The intimacy and time with the sheep is invaluable.
- I am considering and praying about beginning a series in the Gospel of John in January. Ebenezer has not been in a Gospel in at least 5 years since I have been here. I am convinced that spending time learning about Jesus, from Jesus is what we need. I would lay out the book to be exposited over a period of a year, trying not to stay too long in one location.

**Nominating Committee:** This year we had 6 re-elections & 2 new election interviews. The nominating committee met over a period of 3-4 nights in order to conduct interviews of Deacons and Elders. We spent about 30-45 minutes with each candidate asking theological, practical and leadership questions. It was a great time hearing the hearts of our leaders. We have been blessed with a great group of men leaders.

- Weekly meetings with Laszlo, pastoral intern
- Kinship group meetings every other week, going through 1 Samuel
- Attended the newcomer luncheon to meet visitors
- Prison ministry every other week on Friday to visit, pray and do Bible study
- PRC evaluation
- Attended the pastoral appreciation dinner put on by the Women's ministry. It
  was an incredible time of great fellowship, incredible food and a wonderful
  charge by Laura's dad.
- Golf outing with a few BFC pastors

Heavy on my heart is the lack of vision for the ministry in Lynfield, which is the low-income housing development on the south side of Bethlehem. The elders have agreed to pray and seek the Lord's will for what He would have us to do in 2018. I am hoping that the Lord is going to give us a more clear vision of what He wants us to do to reach those people there with the Gospel of Christ.

I am overwhelmed by the opportunity to preach God's Word every week to our people at Ebenezer. Surprisingly, I have not had too much opposition with my teaching. I truly expected to have more push back from my series on the Reformation (5 Solas) in the month of October. However, our people were very positive and the feedback was very encouraging. This speaks volumes as to the maturity level of our congregation. I'm so grateful for the Lord's work in the hearts of our people.

Our family continues to adjust to the changes in our home with the 3 older children leaving the nest. However, we are finding our groove and the Lord is blessing. We look forward to a great year in 2018 serving the Lord at Ebenezer BFC.

### **Kids Crossing**

As guys often are, relational progress has been slower but I know that God will continue to provide opportunities to grow with one another in community.
