Roll Call

Devotional & Prayer

- Pastor Dick led the elders through a devotional from Lamentations 3:22-24. Even though there is a time to weep, the steadfast love and faithfulness is new every morning.
- Elders split into twos to pray over their Shepherd Lists.

Financial Report

- Andy Brimer reviewed the financial report for this month. (Attachment #1) Income year to date is at 98.3% of what is budgeted, and spending is at 96% of what was budgeted.
 A motion was made to approve the November 2016 financial report. This was seconded and passed unanimously.
- Additionally, Andy discussed setting up brokerage accounts which can be done as a non-profit without fees.
 - Motion: Allow Shawn Sommons and Wayne Batten to open and make decisions regarding these accounts with guidance from the Finance Committee. This was seconded and passed unanimously.
 - Motion: Have a standing policy that any Stocks and Mutual Funds be sold immediately, unless there would be a compelling reason not to. This was seconded and passed unanimously.

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made to approve the Elder Meeting minutes from October 10, 2016. This was **seconded** and **passed unanimously**

Discussion Items:

1) Church Discipline Letters

- After considerable discussion, the elder's decided to postpone any formal response so that
 we can do everything possible to assure that the parties involved be restored to their
 relationship with Christ.
- In pursuit of not being a barrier in this process, we have decided to meet with both parties one more time.

2) Discipline Wording to the Church

 The elders decided the hold off on implementing this letter before the congregation pending the result of the meetings with the parties involved.

3) Process for addressing delinquent members

- Pastor Tim presented the process (Attachment 2), and the Elders discussed it.
- **Motion**: To receive this procedure and begin implementing it immediately. This was **seconded** and **passed unanimously**

4) Preparation for Annual Congregational Budget Meeting

- Held December 11, 6:00 pm
- Present budget and hold elections for Elders & Deacons

5) Plans for filling Youth Minister position

- How to move forward with Mark's resignation (Elder's accepted this resignation on 11/9/16)
 - o Resignation submitted to MRC
 - o Farewell reception (Dec 4), congregation will be asked to act upon Mark's resignation.
 - Motion: Allow Culton's to stay in parsonage through January 31. This was seconded and passed unanimously
 - Motion: Elder's determine that Mark's employment will end on December 4. This
 was seconded and passed unanimously
 - Motion: As a gift for acknowledgement of his faithful service, we will continue Mark's compensation through December 31. This was **seconded** and **passed unanimously**
- Plans for filling the position
 - Elders discussed what is necessary for this position, it was decided that we wait and pray.
 - o Elders will meet on Dec 5 to discuss this topic further
- 6) Ideas for Treasurer: One person considered fell through; no more ideas at this time.

7) Report by Property Committee

- Some ideas regarding parsonage use were proposed by the Property Committee after the Cultons move.
- Question regarding the elders proposed use of estate gift. Andy will follow-up with the lawyer for clarification.
- Considering the best way to disburse the Building Fund monies for foyer, sanctuary lighting, and Fellowship Hall (lighting and audio-visual update)

Attached are the following reports for October 2016:

- Graphical representation of Income and Expenses vs Budget, Income vs Expense trends, and Asset trends

In reviewing the financial statements I would like to make the following comments:

- Total income for October was 156% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD income was 98.3% of the budgeted forecast.
- Expenses for October were 105% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD expenses were 96% of the YTD forecast.
- The income for October was above the projected monthly forecast mainly because the projected expenses for the month were the lowest for 2016. The monthly expenses were slightly higher than projected, and the overall spending YTD remains under budgeted expense projections.

Other:

• The Audit Committee continues to review the 2016 records.





2016 Income vs Expenses





2016 Income vs Budget

Procedure for Removing Delinquent Members from the Roll

(Establishment of a Care List & Church Discipline of Delinquent Members)

Whereas, the elders at Ebenezer are very concerned & responsible for the souls of all attendees, but especially those who have entered into a covenant membership with one another (Hebrews 13:7 17), and

Whereas, the elders want to encourage & hold all members accountable for faithful attendance which is best for their soul (Hebrews 10:24-25), and

Whereas, the elders agree that it is **also** the responsibility of the congregation to care for the spiritual welfare of others who have become delinquent in their attendance (Romans 12:10-13),

Resolved, the elders establish a formal care list according to the following parameters in order to properly and gently restore delinquent members:

- 1. Each delinquent member who has not been in attendance for over 6 months will be added to the formal care list.
- 2. Each delinquent member will be contacted at the 6th month point with a letter & an attempted phone call from one of the membership & discipline committee.
- 3. The care list will be presented to the congregation two times a year at each business meeting (July & January). The congregation will be encouraged to make an attempt to contact the delinquent members encouraging them to return to fellowship & worship!
- 4. If after one year of non-attendance, the delinquent member will be removed from the Church role. A letter from the membership & discipline committee will be sent to the delinquent member informing him/her of the discipline that has taken place. The names of the delinquent members will be read at the nearby business meeting.

Pastor Tim's Ministry Report November 14, 2016

Studying & Preaching:

- Sunday morning 2 Peter: I continue to preach through the book of 2 Peter. It is definitely a challenging book that is straight forward. It is a book that keeps preachers honest about preaching. No preacher would preach this passage if Church growth was his primary purpose. I'm thankful for a congregation who is willing to study and listen to the hard chapters of God's Word. I'm praying that the true Sheep will hear the faithful exposition of God's Word.
- Wednesday night I just completed a three-year study through the book of Matthew.
 I plan on doing a few stand-alone messages and begin a new series in the new year.
 I'm still praying about what to teach. I may do a theology study or possibly a study in an Old Testament book.

Shepherding/Ministry:

- Kinship Group We have an incredible group of about 15. I am teaching through the book of Romans with my Kinship group. We are currently in chapter 12. We will finish this semester.

Pastor of Discipleship Report, Oct/Nov 2016

As I continue my trek through the OT, and specifically, in my study of the book of Lamentations, I was reminded once again of this eternal truth:

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him." The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him." (Lamentations 3:22–25, ESV)

The Babylonian siege is over. Judah is now, because of their sin, in captivity in Babylon for seventy years. All seems hopeless, and Jeremiah is lamenting the plight of his people and God's severe judgment upon them. And yet, in the midst of his lament, Jeremiah looks up from his tears and is somehow moved to remember that this same God who has enacted this just judgment, is also the covenant keeping God whose *steadfast love never ceases*. Though his people have sinned, there is hope because God is their portion and that every morning is a new day in which God mercies and faithfulness will be freshly displayed.

How awesome is this reality...though our nation (and many times God's people) has defied God and his judgment is coming, he will show mercy and faithfulness to his covenant community, for our hope lies solely in him alone.

With that in mind, here is a quick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from October/November 2016:

Kids Crossing

- Cross Time Sunday School (10:05 AM): Praise the Lord that he has provided a complete roster of teachers and helpers.
- Early Childhood (2&3 year-olds): We are very close to having a teacher and helper for the 8:45 AM service for the even months...please pray that a helper (we have a teacher) will come forward soon so we can open the 1st service toddler care once again.
- Children's Church: The Gospel Project curriculum worship segment continues to work well for Children's Church. We continue to see between 8-10 students each week.
- **Database Security Check-in:** We have recently moved the database server in-house which provides better performance at a better price. There has been no further issues with checkin except for the school's iPads which will hopefully be replaced with our own in 2017, 1st quarter.
- Wednesday Evening Programs: This year's Awana program has seen between 50-55 children
 every week. We are slowly, but surely, adapting to the new T&T curriculum which is set in an
 environment of discipleship training, allowing each class to go through the weekly themed lesson
 together, and then have that lesson reinforced be the teaching elder at council time. Please pray
 that the Lord would send the volunteers we need, especially for the Sparks groups.

Adult Ministry

- Adult Electives: The fall season continues to be well attended, with the following line-up of classes:
 - Apologetics Rich Mastronardo
 - Introduction to Isaiah Phil Norris
 - o OT Survey Joe Maddock

Continue to pray that the Lord raises up more adult teachers...we currently have 6.

Men's Ministry:

O Bethel Series: The NT phase is currently in session with one class, taught by Jason Lee, on Tuesday evenings from 7:00-9:00.

O Men's Bible Studies/Prayer:

- Thursday mornings from 6:15 AM 7:30 AM, This early morning bible study group is currently studying the book, "Answering the call".
- Thursday mornings from 9:00 AM 10:30 AM, This Men's Bible Study is back in full swing, and studying the book by James MacDonald, "Act Like Men".
- Saturday mornings from 8:00 AM 9:00 AM, This men's pray time is for men who are serious about going before the throne of grace together to cry out to God for their marriages, family, jobs, neighbors, country, etc.
- Women's Ministry: Here is an update from Laura...

"Training: In September I held a facilitator training for perspective Bible study leaders and current leaders. This was a great time of being reminded of the responsibility of leading other women in the word. We had a total of seven ladies that went through this training.

CRY OUT: We held the Cry Out simulcast here in September that was put on by Revive Our Hearts Ministries. We had 4 different churches represented and we had about 40 women in attendance. It was a night of worship and praying scripture over our families, and our churches and our nation. This night was amazing.

Bible Studies:

- o Tis So Sweet continues to be a wonderful time studying Ruth. We will finish up with this study in February. We currently have 8 women that come this study.
- o Mom To Mom: This bible study continues to grow and nourish the women who come out. WE have about 15 moms this year and Lisa Pyles is an amazing mentor mom. I also sit in to help with facilitating this group. We have 4 young ladies who help out with childcare.
- o MOPS: This ministry this year is exploding and Jill Rathmell and Courtney Nagy are fantastic leaders with such tender hearts towards these moms. I think we have over 50 moms and we are maxed to capacity for moppets with over 70 children.
- O HOSEA: Vicki continues to lead this study and has over 20 ladies in attendance.
- o Experiencing God: We have 26 ladies in this morning study and God is really stirring in the hearts of women.
- o Wednesday Morning: Debbie Flanagan has about 15 ladies coming every Wednesday for study there.

Welcome to The Well:

O This new area of ministry is to help women feel more connected in the body here at EBFC. We have met twice, once in October and in November. We doubled in size and we are very excited to see how this ministers to the women.

Currently meet with one lady weekly for encouragement, and others as they come up.

WM team: We currently meet once a month and are looking to plan for a great 2017.

I have been asked to speak at a retreat at the end of April and I am very excited about that."

• **Kinship:** Praise the Lord for Bob & Laurie Gill who have worked hard to place all who have desired to be involved into 18 different groups. We are very excited for the great response to be involved in this core ministry of EBFC!

Other:

- Continued work on the new Church Database as time permitted (especially financial modules).
