

Roll Call & Prayer

The following elders were present: Wayne Batten, Pat Barry, Andy Brimer, Dick Bickings, Mark Culton, Tim Gibson, Swannie Griffin, Scott Holwick, Chris Jones, Byron Roth, and Shawn Sommons. Dennis Flannigan and Kevin Hardy were excused absent. Pastor Tim opened in prayer.

Devotional & Prayer

Pastor Dick led the elders through a devotional time from 2 Samuel 7 on the Davidic Covenant. David was a physical king with a physical kingdom, but there is so much more meaning here. This passage points to the Davidic King, Christ. This Davidic covenant has direct application to us elders, because we are all recipients of this covenant, and we participate in the service of His kingdom and we serve the church, which is how his covenant is spread.

The elders then spent some time in prayer.

Approval of Minutes

Motion was made to approve the minutes from the November 10, 2014 Board of Elders meeting, **seconded** and **passed**.

Discussion Items

- 1) New Elders Tim explained that there are new church mailboxes for the new elders. We talked a bit more about elder assignments without setting these in stone.
- 2) Miracle Month There has already been over \$5,300 raised through Miracle Month.
- 3) <u>Financial Report</u> Andy reviewed the financial report (Attachment 1). Through November we are still light on income (94%), but our expenses are less than projected. A **motion** was made to approve the financial report. This was **seconded** and **passed**.

4) Worship Pastor Position

a. Wayne and Tim shared an update about the worship pastor search. The search committee recommends that we move ahead with the candidate they have recommended. The elders discussed our thoughts of last Saturday's worship time with this candidate. We also talked about vision concerns, and how this should all be communicated to the congregation, as well as worship pastor hiring logistics.

- b. A **motion** was made to accept the recommendation of the search committee and proceed with our candidate to the next step, which will be an interview with the elder board. This was **seconded** and **approved**.
- c. The elders also discussed the salary equity between the pastoral staff. A **motion** was made to assess the salaries of the pastors, as well as come up with a proposed package for the worship pastor candidate. This proposal was **seconded** and **approved**.
- d. The elders put together a timeline for finishing the process with our candidate with the goal of having a vote at the Annual Meeting on January 18th if all goes well.
- 5) <u>Annual Meeting</u> The elders discussed the agenda for the January 18th annual meeting.
- 6) <u>Housing Allowances</u> The pastor's housing allowances were **voted** on. These were **approved**:
 - a. Tim Gibson \$32,341.68
 - b. Dick Bickings \$25,355
 - c. Mark Culton \$5,630
 - d. Jeremy Harkins \$13,300



POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Report Nov/Dec 2014

In my current personal bible reading and study, I recently read this amazing covenantal proclamation given by God, through Nathan the prophet, to David in 2 Samuel 7...

"And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. **Your throne shall be established forever**." In accordance with all these words, and in accordance with all this vision, Nathan spoke to David." (2 Samuel 7:16–17, ESV)

Though I've read this portion many times before, what struck me was the **forever** part. God was telling David that his physical, earthly kingdom, which would enjoy God's hand of blessing during David's life time, had a greater more permanent aspect to it. This of course was in reference to the greatest of David's seed, the Lord Jesus Christ! This reminds me of another passage that we hear often during the Christmas season...

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this." (Isaiah 9:6–7, ESV)

Ultimately, it is this Davidic covenant, and its fulfillment in Jesus Christ that gives me the power and motivation to carry on the work of the ministry to which God has brought me. It is the coming of Christ, his substitutionary death on the cross, his victorious resurrection, and subsequent commission to us to make disciples that gives me, us, our purpose; our reason to exist, thus providing the inseparable link between the prophet Nathan (1000 BC) and Bethlehem Township (2014 AD).

With that in mind, here is a quick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from November/December 2014:

Kids Crossing

- Cross Time Sunday School: Praise the Lord for the full complement of teachers he has given us! We have completed a full year of this Christ centered curriculum, "The Gospel Project", and are greatly encouraged by the feedback from students and teachers. Please continue to pray however, that the Lord would provide a good pool of subs since many times we run into trouble throughout the year when our main teachers are on vacation or sick.
- Early Childhood (2&3 year-olds): Continuing to go well for both services and Sunday School.
- **Children's Church:** The Gospel Project curriculum worship segment continues to work well for Children's Church. We continue to see between 5-12 students each week.
- Wednesday Evening Programs: Our Awana program continues to be effective in teaching the scriptures to our kids through bible memorization, doctrinal truths, and the elder lead teaching of the book of Proverbs. Though there is a smaller T&T group this year, the kids still seem to be excited and engaged. Please pray that the Lord will send the necessary workers, especially in the Sparks group.

Adult Ministry

- Adult Electives: We are winding down the fall semester and are anticipating a great lineup for our new winter semester. We currently reach about 100 people attending the following 3 classes:

 - o Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians Dick Bickings

Please pray that the Lord would send forth some new adult elective teachers so that we may offer a variety of subjects, and give the current teachers a break. We currently only have 5 teachers.

Men's Ministry:

O Bethel Series: We are currently in our holiday hiatus, and will resume our Bethel NT series the first week in January 2015. As a reminder, we have close to 35 students attending our 3 classes. These classes are as follows, Jason Lee's Class, Tuesday evenings from 7:00-9:00 PM, Gail Tshudy's Class for women only, Thursday evenings from 7:00-9:00 PM, and Pastor Dick Bickings' Class on Saturday mornings from 8:00-10:00 AM.

O Men's Bible Studies/Prayer:

- Tuesday mornings from 6:15 AM 8:00 AM, Men's prayer time with currently only 3 men attending.
- Thursday mornings from 6:15 AM 7:30 AM, This early morning bible study group is close to ending their study on Ezra & Nehemiah...stay tuned for information on their next study.
- Women's Ministry: Here is an update from Laura...

"We are concluding our study in 1st and 2nd Thessalonians this week. We have had about 35 faithful women complete this study, and it has been great. Bible study will resume the week of the 13th of January with "Always True" by James McDonald.

MOPS: We have had a wonderful start this year with an abundance of mothers joining us. Our Christmas gathering was wonderful, and Pastor Dick did a great job sharing with us that day. We could still really use more helpers in our Moppets.

Outreach: Both MOPS and WM have been pouring out on the Truth Home. Kim Checkeye came and spoke and the moms were moved to action from that.

Christmas Gathering: We had 40 women join us at the home of the Gibson's for Christmas. We had Linda Williams come and share the Christmas message for us and it was awesome! The ladies loved her and were challenged.

Linda Feichter joined the WM team.

I hosted a "Welcome to my Home" in November and met some great ladies. After the holidays, I will be meeting with a lot of them to make an even stronger connection and hopefully get them plugged into bible study and or small group."
